THE ART AND ARCHITECTURE OF SAN FRANCISCO'S VICTORIANS

The San Francisco Historical Society and the Victorian Alliance of San Francisco are offering our second annual summer arts workshop for middle school students. This workshop is designed to teach young artists and architects about the history of San Francisco's most famous architectural style—the Victorian. This year we'll be offering three five-day workshops.

In this workshop, students will learn about the history of Victorians and how to identify the different styles of Victorian houses. Students will also learn how to use the color wheel to help them come up with a winning color combination for their own "painted lady."

The workshop includes a field trip to Alamo Square, where students will see the city's most famous row of "painted ladies" and explore an amazing restored Victorian.



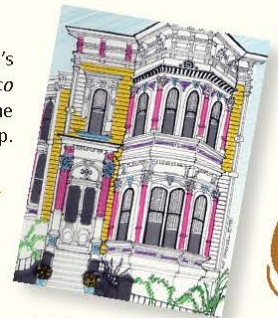
WORKSHOP DATES
